THE BOOK OF PROVERBS

Proverbs 1

The book of Proverbs is a book of wisdom and poetry. Solomon and the other authors wrote down principles and guidelines that people could use to make wise decisions. Solomon wrote that the proverbs help us gain wisdom. Proverbs help us learn about doing what is right and just. They teach one to be thoughtful and to think and plan. A wise person should listen and continue to learn. The only way to gain wisdom is to honor and trust in the LORD. Foolish people hate wisdom.

Solomon wrote, "Listen my son to your father's instructions. Do not reject what your mother teaches you. If a sinner tempts you to sin, do not give in. If someone invites you to hurt an innocent person for fun, you should not join them. Do not set foot on their path. Their feet are running toward evil. Those who seek to make money using dishonesty only create trouble for themselves."

Next, Solomon wrote about wisdom using words that described it like it was a person. Solomon described wisdom as a woman calling out warnings to people. She warns people to listen to her and not to ignore her. Those who ignore wisdom will face trouble. Then they will look for wisdom, but she will be gone because they rejected her knowledge. They did not honor the LORD. They refused all of wisdom's help. But those who listen to wisdom and trust in God will be safe.

Younger Children's Activity

Resources Needed: Flowerpots, potting soil, stickers, sharpies, plastic spoons, potting soil, vinca flower seeds, gallon Ziploc bags (one per child), tape, di-cut flowers (one per child), skewers (one per child)

Older Children's Activity

BIBLE VERSE PATH

Tools: painter's tape, dry erase board and marker

- ☐ Create a straight path with painter's tape. Print the words of Proverbs 1:7 on the dry erase board.
- □ Option: Substitute the Text Truth for the Bible Verse. Adjust the application wording as needed.
- Tell kids they will cross the path in different ways while saying an important verse from today's study of Proverbs 1.
- Ask kids to cross the path in different ways, such as hopping on one foot, bear crawling, crawling, walking backwards, crossing sideways, scissor stepping, and so on.
- Say: "Memorizing Scripture will help us to always think about God's Word. Scripture can help us make better choices. We should understand that wisdom comes from God. God's Word, the Bible, gives us instructions on how to live in wise ways. We should respect God and obey His Word."

GROUND VOLLEYBALL

Tools: Item 9: "Review Questions" (Printables), beach ball, chairs

- □ Place chairs in a line so that kids can sit on either side of the line on the floor.
- Form two teams and assign teams a spot on either side of the chair row, facing each other.
- Say: "We are going to play ground volleyball. You play just like regular volleyball but no standing (or spiking)."
- On your signal, the teams will start volleying the ball back and forth.
- When it touches the ground, the team that missed will answer a "Review Question."
- Continue playing, asking questions each time the ball lands on the ground.
- Say: "You all did a great job keeping that ball in the air and listening to today's Bible story. Remember, to find wisdom, we first must honor and respect God."

OSTRACON

Long before sticky notes and scrap pieces of paper, people wrote and doodled on broken pieces of pottery. These ancient notes are called ostraca.

This ostracon contains a poem about a son who ignores his father's advice. It was unearthed in DEIR EL-MEDINA, EGYPT. The ancient artisans who lived there called themselves "SERVANTS IN THE PLACE OF TRUTH."

PROVERBS 1:8 says, "Listen, my son, to your father's instruction, and don't reject your mother's teaching." Solomon wrote this proverb to a young man, and it helps everyone know to HONOR THEIR PARENTS AND RESPECT GOD.

WHAT'S A GENRE?

A GENRE IS A CATEGORY OR GROUP OF THINGS SHARING A SIMILAR STYLE.

Each book of the Bible belongs to a genre. The six genres of the Bible are LAW, HISTORY, POETRY & WISDOM, PROPHECY, GOSPELS, and LETTERS.

Some of the genre names match division names!

The style of the book of Proverbs is "wisdom literature," so it belongs in the poetry & wisdom genre.

Wisdom literature was a style common among many cultures in Old Testament times. This genre deals with philosophy, ideas, common sense and...wisdom!

The IO divisions of the Bible help us know how the Bible is arranged and where books are located. The six genres of the Bible help us know what style a book is written in.

HOW YOUR BRAIN LEARNS

Your brain contains around 85 billion neurons microscopic cells that can connect together through dendrites and synapses to form "pathways."

These pieces work together to transmit information to other parts of your brain and to parts of your body through your nervous system.

For example, you have neurons and pathways that:

- + recognize letters and their sounds
- + know the letters in your name
- + help your body pick up, hold, and move a pencil

Neurons connect each of these pathways to share information and work together to help you write your name!
