The Ministry Plan is our plan for ministry to our congregation and beyond for the 2024-25 year. We are looking forward to the many opportunities God will give us to encourage, care for, and challenge each other and those we have not yet met to follow The Jesus Way in every part of life. The Ministry Plan provides the thought behind and intentions for the ministry we have planned for the coming year.

Our Priorities

We have considered our unique position to minister to Arlington and beyond, and have evaluated our current ministry depth and areas of dedication over the years. We have many strong ministry areas that have grown in the fertile soil of our focus and resourcing. Our Worship expressions, our Spiritual Formation focus, our Bible Study structure, and Missions are all areas that we have dedicated significant time and resources to establishing and growing.

We have chosen the following areas for intentional focus for 2024-25 and beyond. We are excited to see how God will make our church what He wants us to be for this time and place in His world.

Young Families

Increasingly, young adults in North America are leaving faith behind. We recognize the pressing need to be a church that serves, equips, and comes alongside young adults as they try to follow The Jesus Way. We want to be a church that loves young adults well, across all of



the phases of young adult life. A church family who loves and supports one another through job challenges and successes, events like marriage and welcoming children, and life disappointments can make all of the difference. God draws us together to grow and minister to one another within His church in order to navigate life in ways that honor and glorify Him!



Reaching New People

One indication that something is alive is that it grows! As individuals we want to grow spiritually and in other healthy ways. We want our children to grow and become all that God created them to be. Growth requires risk, trying new things, and sometimes leaving the comfort we have known. The support and love we provide would be such a gift to new members of the family of God and to fellow Christians who are new to Arlington. We have space to add many new people to our church. Ministry Plan Care

The Congregational Life Ministry exists to provide care and support for our congregation and staff through programming, support ministry, visitations, 1-on-1 companionship and more. Through the ministries of our office, we shepherd our people as they encounter the more difficult parts of life - from grief and illness to financial hardship and isolation. We also provide care, connection and alignment for our staff through scheduled meetings, retreats, check-ins and more. This ministry also includes support of our deacons in their varied ministries across the life of our church: Lord's Supper and Baptism support, deacon training materials, meeting supplies and more.

In the coming year, we anticipate hosting upwards of 25 funerals, serving our families with the highest level of competence and compassion. We also will continue to provide grief, divorce, and cancer support, while exploring other ways to support our members in deeper need. We will continue the vital work of visiting and caring for our people in hospitals, rehabs, and residential centers through our Lay Care Team.

On the staff side, we are striving to keep our staff healthy, holy and effective! We have plans for a Staff Retreat at Riverbend in the fall. We also have a full slate of staff meetings for development and collaboration, and we have professional development opportunities for conferences, conventions and other growth moments. We also offer staff support in the way of professional counseling through our partnership with The Center for Integrative Counseling and Psychology.

This vibrant ministry is vital to the health of our church and we could not do it without the relentless work of our laypeople and the generous support of our church budget. We're grateful for the resources to do it - and to do it together!

The Engagement Ministry

Young Families

Our Young Families Ministry aims to give parents or guardians the tools and resources they need to disciple their children. Here is a snapshot of just some of the ministries and programs we are hosting to accomplish this goal.

At the end of April, we will host Faith at Home Weekend, an opportunity for families to engage in kid-friendly worship and to equip parents with valuable parenting resources. While parents receive training from our Young Families Team, dedicated volunteers pour into our children through discipleship classes. This past December, our church hosted Family Christmas ADVENTure, where nearly 500 people gathered on our campus to experience the Christmas story through song, interactive activities, games, and a message from our Pastor. Family Getaway falls every Labor Day weekend. Hosted at the beautiful Riverbend Retreat Center, this retreat allows our young families to connect through a variety of recreational activities.



It's hard to disciple someone else if you are not growing. Our Sunday morning Bible study groups are led by knowledgeable and caring teachers who help our adults engage and apply the Word of God to their daily lives. We currently offer five Sunday School groups for young families and/or young adults. An additional class is starting August 2024 for nearly and newly married couples. Throughout the year, we also offer opportunities for our adults to connect through young adult breakfasts, social nights, and date nights.

Preschool Ministry

There are many fun and exciting things happening for our preschool families. Last Fall, we launched our new Midweek programming, which includes Masterpiece Electives for PreK – 4th grade. Each week, children come to learn from a talented master craftsman who teaches them a skill. More importantly, we remind them that they are God's Masterpiece, each created to be creative and glorify God through those giftings (Eph. 2:10). We have 65 family units (over 100 kids) registered who participate on Wednesday nights. We anticipate continued growth and momentum as we look forward to continuing Midweek in Fall 2024.

Kinder Bible School is taking on a new look this summer with a firstcentury theme called **"Hometown Nazareth: Where Jesus Was a Kid."** Entering kindergarten and first graders will gather not only to engage the word of God but to learn about what it was like to live in Jesus' time. We encourage children and parents to invite their friends, neighbors, and other family members as an opportunity to introduce them to Jesus.

Sunday mornings are our best opportunity to engage new families and consistently teach children about Jesus. We are thankful for faithful volunteers who commit to share the love of Jesus week in and week out. Other events, like Open Play and Story in the Park, are great outreach opportunities for moms to connect with other moms as well as invite other families to an organized play time where we can introduce them to our church.





Children's Ministry

The goal of the Children's Ministry is to meet the needs of our children by helping every child follow Jesus, make friends, and have fun. We do this by providing weekly age-graded Sunday morning group experiences, The Bridge, and Masterpiece Elective classes that engage children at their developmental level.

Recognizing that parents are the spiritual leaders for their families, the Children's Ministry provides resources and classes to equip them as we partner to lead their children's spiritual journey.

Children are motivated by fun. Therefore, we offer activities throughout the year that allow children to make friends and learn how to grow in their relationship with Jesus. We provide monthly Family Movie Nights and Game Nights to bring families together. These nights engage families in our broader community, opening the door to a fun experience at church. Additionally, we offer parent and child connection events like the mother-daughter, mother-son, father-son, and daddy-daughter experiences that build family relationships.

Our summer is full of fun activities, camps, and events that create opportunities for us to reach new families and provide a focus on building our relationship with Jesus. These events include Connect Camp, WOW Camps, and Gaga and Games days.

Our Children's Ministry collaborates with the Preschool and Young Adult Ministries to form the Young Families Team. We desire to provide events that strengthen and bring families closer together, like Faith at Home and the Family Getaway.

Youth Ministry

Along with our church, the Youth Ministry is focused on the theme of Together! We are intentionally cultivating a place of belonging for every student who walks through our door. Belonging is vitally important and lays the foundation for growth and serving.

Over the next year, we will continue to focus on outreach, followup, and encouragement alongside our deeply committed adult volunteers. We've seen over 75 documented guests this school year! We will continue to empower our students to invite their friends and process their faith together.

We'll continue to offer students next steps, whether that's baptism, serving throughout the church, or taking leadership as a Family Leader or Big Brother/Sister.

We will partner with campus ministries to be more present in our local schools and develop relationships beyond our four walls.

We have amazing programs and events planned, but this is the heart behind what we do. In 2024-2025, we aim to:

- Provide training and support for our incredible adult volunteers.
- Host intentional times of connection for students and their parents as the primary disciples in their lives.
- Cultivate a youth ministry culture where students want to invite their friends.
- Equip students to have faith conversations within their spheres of influence.
- Offer opportunities for cross-cultural engagement through our ministry partners.
- Develop student leaders through opportunities like Lead Teams, Family Leaders, Big Brother/Sister, and more.







College Ministry

Our mission statement at FBCA College is, "We want God's best for college students and take action to see it happen." More than providing fun events, hang-out spaces, and Bible studies (though we do have all of those), we strive to create a culture of disciple-makers. This call to make disciples is for all Christians, and we believe college students can set the pace for this at FBCA.

With that in mind, we're looking ahead to 2024-25 with eager expectations for how God will keep blowing our minds. Our goal for our students is that they would be the godly friends their friends need. To that end, our discipleship plan for students connects them with a mentor, holds them accountable to make disciples, and invests in their spiritual growth. Our college students are living this out, and we're seeing them grow, transform, and invite their friends to know Jesus.

As students become disciple-makers, we provide spaces to invite and invest. From our fun events like Dollar Steak Night and the Scavenger Hunt to our weekly Thursday night worship, students can dive deeper into their faith and invite their friends to join them. We've been developing this culture and strategy over the last two years and are excited to continue it in this coming year.

In recent years, we've seen several students turn their lives over to Christ at the College Ministry. I pray that through meaningful friendship and consistent elevation of the Gospel, we'll see many more in 2024 and beyond. God is at work, and we want to be faithful disciple-makers for His glory.

We regularly prayer walk the campus and listen for God's leading to those He is drawing to Himself. Weekly there are 5 active small group Bible studies.

God is doing exciting things in the lives of our students! Some are exploring calls to missions and ministry. Some are finding faith for the first time. Some are diving deeper than ever. It is our prayer that we would be a community that provides a space for the next generation to take hold of their faith, run with it, and see God move. By his blessing, we are seeing that happen!





Ministry Plan

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Young Adults Ministry

Worship 817

Our Young Adults Ministry seeks to help emerging adults (20-35-yearolds) in our area connect with each other, the church, and Jesus. We primarily accomplish this through a new ministry called 817. 817 has several branches of ministry. There's Worship **817**, a night of music and message that occurs on the third Tuesday of every month. We also have Party 817, a series of fellowship events that occur between our worship nights. In the future, we will create new opportunities for missional engagement and young adult outreach through Serve **817**.

Parents

Parenting is hard. It takes more patience, love, care, and organization than we can muster most days. Our Young Adults Ministry endeavors to strengthen and disciple our young parents so that they can disciple their children. The foundation of the Young Adults Ministry is our Bible study groups. We currently offer five classes (Yellow Submarine, Foundation, Rooted, Career, and Launch) that meet every Sunday morning to study God's word together. Our Wednesday night programming also offers classes focused on parenting.

Our ministry to young parents extends into our blossoming marriage ministry. As we build, this ministry will include premarital counseling for engaged couples utilizing material from Saving Your Marriage Before It Starts (SYMBIS), a nearly and newly married class (beginning in August 2024), date night opportunities, quarterly marriage enriching seminars, and eventually a couple's retreat.

Lastly, our ministry offers opportunities for young adults to connect and socialize. We do this through regular events, like Young Adult Breakfasts and Class Social Night. We also encourage our young adults to connect with other ministries in the church, like the Women's or Men's Ministry.







Adult Ministry

At FBCA, our Adult Ministry includes engaging Sunday morning Bible studies and vibrant men's and women's ministries. Our dedicated volunteers lead impactful Bible studies, delving into studies like 9 Foundational Truths and equipping us with resources like the FBCA Catechism. There are countless opportunities for fellowship and community building, from weekly game days and Pastor's Bible Study to special events like square dancing and chili cookoffs. To help prepare adults for all stages of life, seminars explored topics such as parenting, aging faithfully, and spiritual practices for families. Through retreats like FORGED at the River for men and the IF Gathering for women, we've been challenged and inspired in our faith journeys. As we reflect on the past year, we're grateful for the generosity that has enabled these ministries to flourish, providing avenues for spiritual growth, community, and sharing the gospel. Looking ahead, we're committed to providing opportunities for individuals to deepen their understanding of God's word and live out their faith authentically, following The Jesus Way!

This next year of ministry will be built on doing life Together... Whether it is Together for God's Glory, for the Gospel, for the Future, or to the Nations, the ministry for adults will be focused on helping them live out Ephesians 4 and the idea of togetherness as the people of God. Together, we will take the truth of God's love to young adults and families searching for answers in a troubled world. Together, we will intentionally invite our friends, neighbors, and coworkers to know Jesus's great love for them. Together, we will use the wonderful resources we are blessed to have as a church to love our community. God has given us a great opportunity to reach our community, and I am excited to partner with you and use this ministry plan to spread the gospel *Together*.









Traditionals Ministry

The Traditionals Care Ministry is committed to providing Care and Connection for both our church members as well as friends in the community who need a church family. Everything we do, from fellowships like our weekly games, to our monthly Magnificent Mondays fellowships, to our Senior seminars, classes, and more are all designed to be opportunities for our members to invite guests to come and to provide points of connection and ministry with and among our church family.

Additionally, we are intentionally connecting with multiple residential living communities where our church members live. We have identified nearly 80 church members who live in 18 different communities in the area. This includes every type of residential community... from independent living to skilled nursing units to residential rehab units. We make regular visits, phone calls, and contacts with them. We recently began a pilot ministry at one community where several church members live.

Each Sunday evening at Pantego Morada, we have between 15 and 20 residents, both church members and non-members, gather in their community room to watch that morning's worship service. Community is being built there. They pray for one another, visit one another in the hospital, attend funerals for one another, encourage one another, and participate in the Lord's Supper together. One resident, who isn't a FBCA member and faithfully attends each week, shared that it had been 8 years since she was able to be in worship and is grateful our church has begun this ministry. Lives are being impacted! At another community, Town Village, one of our FBCA members living there began a conversation with a new resident and found that she wanted to find a church home to join. During one of our visits there, we were able to accept her into our fellowship. Even though she will not be able to physically attend our church, she will be ministered to and cared for by our homebound ministry and she will have a church home to give her tithe.

We will be collaborating with our Young Adult Ministry to find points of connection between our Trads and our Young Families. Many in each ministry don't have family living close by and our desire is to connect the two and find ways to mentor, bless, encourage, pray for, and fellowship together into the future.

We want every member in our ministry to be genuinely loved, cared for, prayed over, and ministered to no matter what stage of life or health they find themselves in. We are blessed to have an incredible wealth of spiritually mature Christ followers who desire to continue growing in their relationship with our God and serving Him every day!





Classic Worship

Through our 3 Global Centers, we are witnessing a movement of disciple-makers, empowered to radiate Christ's love and truth in diverse spheres. In the coming months we will prepare to commission Jacob & Kayla for long-term ministry in Western Europe, while welcoming Lillie as she completes her time of service at this Global Center. Meanwhile, in Central Europe, Ryan and Sarah are transitioning their church-plant to national leadership within the year. In West Africa, we witness the transformative touch of God through healthcare initiatives, church-planting endeavors, and orphan care ministries, impacting thousands of lives and raising up hundreds of new believers each year. As we strive to deepen our engagement with these established Global Centers, our focus remains on congregational connection, mobilization of volunteer trips and interns, and support for our cross-cultural workers and the apostolic vision of the Great Commission.

As we look on the horizon, we note that our interconnected world is navigating various challenges and economic uncertainties urge us to reassess our priorities. Rather than solely emphasizing traditional cross-cultural sending endeavors, our goal at FBCA is to empower individuals to spread Christ's message and make disciples everywhere, amplifying our global impact. With Gen-Z showing declining religious identification and our city hosting diverse populations, we recognize the need for adaptation. By equipping leaders to effectively share the gospel and lead ministries, we are prepared to meet present and future challenges while advancing the message of Jesus in innovative ways. This next season we will plan, develop, and implement ways to help our congregation be effective witnesses who embody the teachings of Jesus within their spheres of influence.







Local Engagement

This year saw the launch of Table Groups: small, missional communities that come together to learn and practice missional skills and create opportunities to build relationships with people outside the church. Our Table Groups have thrown parties in neighborhoods, connected with stay-athome parents in parks and public libraries, and had intentional conversations about Jesus with the people in the places where they live, work, and play. Local Engagement has continued to offer opportunities for our church to grow in its evangelistic sensitivity by providing training opportunities on the first Sunday of the month at Equipping Nights. We continue to develop the ways that we connect with and follow up with guests who visit us on Sundays. We have adopted a robust system of follow up that includes text messaging, e-mail, and a hand written card for every family. We look forward to the launch of Connect Points in the Center Street lobby and in the lobby of the PCB. At these points, volunteers will be ready to welcome guests, learn more about them, provide them with a gift, and help them get connected in Bible Study or worship. We have connected with roughly 185 adult guests on Sunday mornings since April 2023.





Ministry Plan Opening our Campus

One of our declared priorities for 2024-25 is to open our campus to welcome the community and our congregation for connection opportunities in addition to our traditional ministry offerings.

Our **Good Day Café** serves as an informal gathering space to socialize, relax, and connect with others. Our target audience in 2024-25 is UTA college students. We are walking distance from campus, and we are not overcrowded like our sister coffee shops. We offer a relaxing environment with Wi-Fi, comfortable seating, and a variety of beverages, as well as delicious food, for times of interaction for social connection or productive work.

The Good Day Café donates \$1.23, the cost of caring for a Sierra Leone orphan for a day, of every premium product purchase. Last year our congregation and community provided over 7,000 GOOD DAYS through the Restore Hope Orphan Sponsorship Program!

The FLX (Family Life Experience) successfully rebranded last year. With the addition of new trainers, equipment, and partnership with Silver Sneakers, we will provide more than just a gym in the upcoming year. Our goal is to invite our nearby apartment community and downtown professionals to take advantage of our convenient location and low-cost memberships. Improved physical health is important but we hope to create recreational fellowship and a sense of belonging. Our pickleball and basketball participation is booming, with more fitness offerings to come!

The Gathering Table, our catering and food service ministry, is ready to provide delicious food for your gatherings as well as our church ministries. We look forward to our skilled chef and staff providing food for your guests to have the memorable experiences you desire as you host them. In addition to our expanded catering menu, we are adding an exciting new option of dinner for 4 to go, targeting young CDC families.

The Suite Spot is our new co-working space in Suite 120 of the Wade Building. Suites are available daily, weekly or monthly for modern professionals who do not





work in a traditional workplace building. This use of available space on our campus provides a cost effective and flexible option for the professional who desires nice office space and networking opportunities and gives us an opportunity to create relationships and have spiritual conversations with those who share our space.

The Purpose Print Shop continues to print for not only our ministries but for many other churches and ministries, supporting their Kingdom impact. The addition of website ordering this year will provide the opportunity to serve our current customers more efficiently and help us expand our reach to new customers.

God has blessed us with facilities and resources to reach out to our community. We are strategically located in downtown Arlington and look forward to opportunities from God to build authentic relationships and share the love of Christ in our day-to-day interactions.

Ministry Plan Facilities Update



Almost two years ago, the church embarked on a journey to modernize the HVAC systems in our main church buildings and Student Center. A combination of aging equipment and damage from the great winter freeze of 2021 necessitated a near-total overhaul of the HVAC equipment and computer controls. Working with our insurance provider and Polk Mechanical, we developed and presented a plan that the church voted to approve in May of 2022.

Polk has been busy installing new equipment, removing outdated infrastructure, implementing new controls, and optimizing our systems for maximum comfort and efficiency.


As of today, we are in the final stages of this project. All of the equipment is in place, and the new computer controls are installed and are being configured. The technicians are finetuning everything with the goal of being completely finished this Spring. We are already seeing improved consistency in our temperatures.

Our Facilities Team continues to care for our campus. In addition to the ongoing maintenance and cleaning of our facilities, our plans for the coming year include these projects:

- Additional safety measures for our Preschool and Children's building.
- Increased attention and care for our landscaping and flower beds.
- Refreshing our campus signage.
- Lastly, we are currently working with the City of Arlington and UTA to implement a permanent solution to our traffic safety concerns on the south side of our Children's Building.









